CITY EFFORTS: DIRECT OVERSIGHT

- Taxis
 - One-day, in-house SFMTA safety training
 - One-week, private safety training course
- Muni
 - Nine-week training course
- Employees
 - On-line defensive driving course
 - In-person, in-vehicle course for frequent drivers in some divisions



CITY EFFORTS: REQUIREMENTS AND COLLABORATION

- City vendors
 - Must provide large vehicle training
- Commuter Shuttles
 - Required Large Vehicle Training as part of program participation
- Tour Buses
 - Voluntary participation by eight of largest companies
- TNC's / Ride Source
 - Voluntary: Lyft and Uber have produced safety videos that are consistent with the city's training.
